

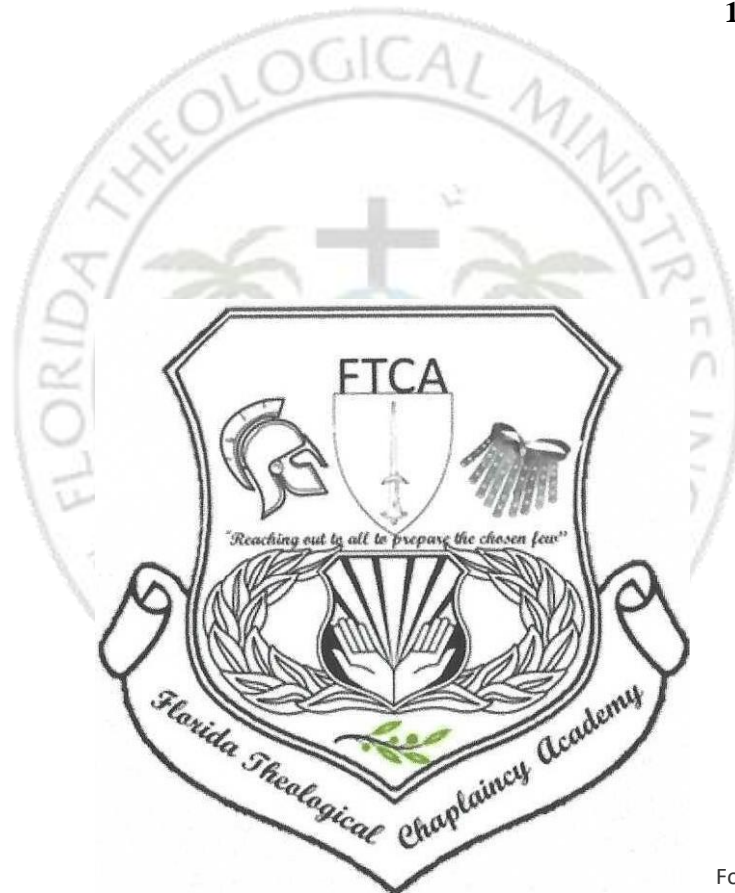

Refund Policy

Florida Theological Chaplaincy Academy

Florida Theological Chaplaincy Academy is committed to fairness, transparency, and integrity in all financial matters. The following refund policy outlines the terms and conditions regarding tuition and fees.

1. Tuition Payment Plan

All application and registration fees are non-refundable. These fees cover administrative processing and enrollment preparation.

Payment Options

Transfer Fee \$300.00

\$100.00 Application/Registration Fee (non-refundable)

Remaining balance: \$200.00

2 weekly payments of \$100.00

2. Tuition Refund Schedule

Students who officially withdraw from a course or program may be eligible for a partial refund of tuition based on the following schedule:

Before Course Start Date: 100% tuition refund (excluding application/registration fees)

Week 1 of Course: 75% tuition refund

Week 2 of Course: 50% tuition refund

Week 3 of Course: 25% tuition refund

After Week 3: No refund will be issued

3. Withdrawal Process

To be eligible for any refund, students must submit a formal written withdrawal request to the administration office. The effective date of withdrawal will be the date the request is received.

4. Non-Participation

Failure to attend classes or participate in coursework does not constitute official withdrawal. Students who do not formally withdraw will not be eligible for a refund.

5. Program Cancellation

If Florida Theological Chaplaincy Academy cancels a course or program for any reason, students will receive a full refund of all tuition paid, including applicable fees.

6. Transfer of Tuition

In certain circumstances, students may request to transfer paid tuition to a future course session instead of receiving a refund. Approval is granted at the discretion of the administration.

7. Special Circumstances

Requests for exceptions due to emergencies or extenuating circumstances (such as medical issues) may be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. Supporting documentation may be required.

8. Refund Processing

Approved refunds will be processed within 7–14 business days from the date of approval and issued using the original method of payment whenever possible.

Module 6: Strategic Spiritual Warfare

1. Foundational

Strategic Spiritual Warfare is the intentional use of prayer, biblical authority, and discernment to confront and overcome spiritual opposition while advancing God's purpose.

2. Academic / Training

Strategic Spiritual Warfare is a structured approach to targeted intercession, equipping individuals with scriptural strategies to address strongholds and serve effectively in ministry and leadership.

3. Ministry / Empowerment

Strategic Spiritual Warfare empowers believers to break spiritual barriers through prayer, fasting, and spiritual authority, bringing victory, restoration, and breakthrough.



Grading System

Florida Theological Chaplaincy Academy maintains a standard of academic excellence designed to ensure that students are both knowledgeable and prepared for effective ministry. Student performance is evaluated through assignments, exams, participation, and practical application.

Grading Scale:

A (90–100%) – Excellent: Demonstrates outstanding understanding, application, and engagement

B (80–89%) – Good: Above-average performance with strong comprehension

C (70–79%) – Satisfactory: Meets minimum course requirements

D (60–69%) – Needs Improvement: Below standard; limited understanding

F (Below 60%) – Failing: Does not meet course requirements

Additional Grading Components:

Class Participation & Engagement

Quizzes and Exams

Practical Ministry Demonstrations (where applicable)

Passing Requirement:

Students must achieve a minimum grade of 70% (C) to successfully pass a course and receive credit toward certification.

Attendance Policy

Consistent attendance and active participation are essential components of student success and spiritual development.

Attendance Expectations:

Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes (live or online) and complete all coursework on time

Active participation in discussions, assignments, and ministry activities is required.

Absences:

Students may have up to 2 excused absences during an 8-week course.

Absences must be communicated to the instructor in advance when possible.

Excessive Absences:

More than 2 absences may result in a reduction of the final grade.

Students who miss a significant portion of the course may be required to retake the class.

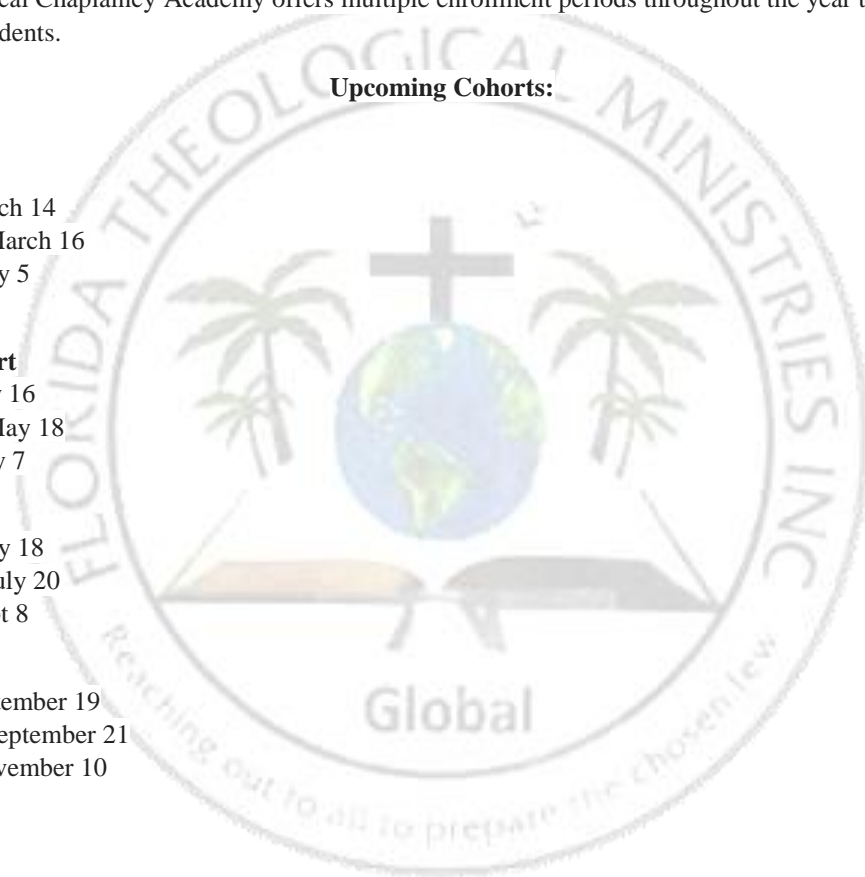

Florida Theological Chaplaincy Academy Graduation Application

Students who have successfully completed all program requirements must submit a Graduation Application to be considered for certification and participation in the graduation ceremony.

Application Requirements:

Completion of all coursework and program requirements
Minimum passing grade of 70% (C) in all courses
Fulfillment of attendance and participation standards
Completion of final exam or capstone project
All tuition and fees paid in full

Application Process:

Submit a completed Graduation Application Form
Provide any required final documentation (assignments, evaluations, etc.)
Receive administrative review and approval

Application Deadline:

Graduation applications must be submitted no later than 2 weeks prior to the scheduled graduation date
Graduation Dates (Sample Schedule)
Graduation ceremonies are held at the conclusion of each cohort to honor and celebrate student achievement.
